

Excellency has demanded him as a fugitive from Justice; Now therefore there are to authorize you to deliver the said Robert Barber to Joseph Gray, the agent appointed by his Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania, to receive and convey him to that State - the said Agent first paying all the costs and charges of the arrest and detention of the said Robert Barber.

This day the Governor issued a passport to Joseph Gray, the Agent appointed by his Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania, to receive and convey to that State, Robert Barber a fugitive from Justice.

June 10<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor issued the following *Stolli Prosequi* of State of Maryland, - To Wit,

Whereas a certain Francis R. Williamson late of the United States Navy stands charged with larceny, and is now in confinement in jail at Baltimore; And whereas the said Francis R. Williamson has been recommended to Executive clemency by Commodore Ridgely, with the consent of the Secretary of the Navy, and by the acting Attorney for the State, and the Magistrate who committed the said Williamson:

Now therefore I Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby grant a *Stolli Prosequi* to the said Francis R. Williamson on account of the aforesaid offence, upon condition that the said Williamson shall within thirty days from the date of his release enter into service in the Navy of the United States, and order and direct that all further proceedings him on the charge aforesaid do cease and determine, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him, for or on account of said offence.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland on this tenth day of June eighteen hundred and forty four, and of the Independence of the United States the sixty eighth.
