

June 18th 1844

This day the Governor remitted the fine of ten dollars imposed on Marcus Weid, by W^m B. Jones, Esq. a Justice of the Peace for Baltimore city, for violation of the Act relating to Hawkers and Peddlers.

June 21st 1844

This day the Governor granted a Pardon to Joseph Baldwin who was convicted at June Term 1844, of Baltimore City Court, of Felony.

June 22^d 1844.

This day the Governor issued the following Order to the Sheriff of Washington County.

Whereas, it appears from certain documents transmitted to me by His Excellency the Governor of Virginia that Joseph Green stands charged in said State with Felony, in feloniously stealing, taking, and carrying away, a certain Mare, Saddle and Bridle then in possession of a certain Nerval Selcott, and that having fled from the justice of that state he has taken refuge in the State of Maryland, and it appearing that he is now in your custody; and Whereas His Excellency has demanded him as a fugitive from Justice, NOW Therefore there are to authorise you to deliver the said Joseph Green to James Travern the Agent appointed by his Excellency the Governor of Virginia to receive and convey him to the said State, — the said Agent first paying all the costs and charges of the arrest and detention of the said Joseph Green.

For all which this shall be your sufficient Warrant and authority.

This day the Governor remitted the fine of sixteen dollars imposed upon Stephen Allen at April Term 1844, of Anne Arundel County, for selling liquor without License.

June 28th 1844

This day the Governor granted a Pardon to Robert Curtain, convicted in Baltimore City Court at June Term 1844. of Larceny.

July 1st 1844

This day the Governor issued the following Order to the Sheriff of Baltimore County, &

Whereas it appears by certain documents transmitted to me by His Excellency the Governor of Virginia that a certain Charles Turner Torrey stands charged by Indictment of the Grand Jury, at June Term 1844, of the Circuit Superior Court of Frederick County with feloniously stealing, taking, and carrying away, a certain negro slave the property of Bushrod Taylor of said County and State, and that having fled from the justice of that State he has taken refuge in the State
