

July 12th 1844.

This day the Governor issued the following Order to the Sheriff of Cecil County, &c.
To the Sheriff of Cecil County, Greeting:

Whereas it appears by certain documents transmitted to me by His Excellency the Governor of Delaware that a certain James Taylor, negro, stands charged and convicted of the crime of Larceny in the said State of Delaware, and that having fled from the justice of that State, he has taken refuge in the State of Maryland, and Whereas His Excellency has demanded him as a fugitive from Justice;

NOW Therefore, these are to authorize you to cause the said James Taylor to be apprehended if he is in your bailiwick and delivered to David L. Moody, the agent appointed by his Excellency the Governor of Delaware to receive and convey him to the said State, — the said agent first paying all the costs and charges of the arrest and detention of the said James Taylor

For all which this shall be your sufficient Warrant and authority.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland on this Twelfth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four.

This day the Governor released the fines imposed by Calvert County Court, at May Term 1844, on Hoy Woodbury and Benjamin Ireland, for selling liquor without license.

July 17th 1844

This day the Governor issued the following Order to the Sheriff of Baltimore County, &c.

To the Sheriff of Baltimore County, Greeting,

Whereas it appears by certain documents transmitted to me by his Excellency the Governor of Rhode Island, that Edward Simons, alias Jack Williams, stands charged with the crime of Larceny, committed in said State, and that having fled from the justice of that State, he has taken refuge in the State of Maryland, and it appearing that he is now in your custody; and Whereas His Excellency has demanded him, as a fugitive from justice; NOW Therefore these are to authorize you to deliver the said Edward Simons, alias Jack Williams to James Young, the agent appointed by His Excellency the Governor of Rhode Island to receive and convey him to the said State, — the said agent first paying all the costs and charges of the arrest and detention of the said Edward Simons, alias Jack Williams.

For all which this shall be your sufficient Warrant and authority.
