March 7<sup>th</sup> 1845-

The Governor this day refused to grant a Nolle Prosequi to Lewis W. Evans indicted in Kent County Court for a Libel.

March 7<sup>th</sup> 1845-

The Gov. this day refused to grant a Nolle Prosequi to Edward Browne Junr. of Kent County indicted in Kent County Court in three cases for assaults with intent to kill.

March 7<sup>th</sup> 1845-

The Gov. this day refused to grant a Nolle Prosequi to William James of Baltimore City indicted in Anne Arundel County Court at the April Term of said Court 1844, for keeping a Gaming Table.

March 7<sup>th</sup> 1845-

The Gov. this day nominated George N. Howard as Register of Wills for Cecil County vice James rejected by the Senate.

March 8<sup>th</sup> 1845-

The Gov. this day refused to grant a Permission of the fine costs imposed by Talbot County Court upon Joseph Gray on a forfeited recognizance entered into by him before said Court.

March 10<sup>th</sup> 1845-

The Gov. this day refused to grant a Nolle Prosequi to Richard Wise, William N. Albert, John Oseringer & Franklin Herbert of Washington County indicted for an assault & battery at the Nov. Term of said Court 1844.

The Gov. this day refused to grant a Nolle Prosequi to Frederick G. W. Kapp of Washington County indicted for forgery of certificates of Naturalization.

The Gov. this day nominated William N. Stewart, Charles Howard, William H. Giles as the Board of Managers of the State Colonization fund.

The Gov. this day nominated as Commissioners to take the acknowledgment of deeds: Daniel Byrne for the State of Louisiana, William M. Kirk for the State of Ohio, & Joseph H. Bradley for the District of Columbia also Daniel Burgee for the State of Louisiana.

The Gov. also on this day made sundry nominations for Auctioneers, Justices of the peace &c. &c. for which see the Book of Record of Executive Nominations.

March 18<sup>th</sup> 1845-

The Gov. this day refused to grant a pardon to David Hargate indicted and convicted in Frederick County Court at the March Term of said Court 1845 of the crime of perjury & by the said Court sentenced to the Penitentiary.

March 19<sup>th</sup> 1845-

The Gov. this day issued commissions to James Claypoole & George L. Hoffmann as additional Leather Inspectors for Balt. City.
