

April 26th 1845

R. H. Latham The Gov. This day upon the affidavit of Robert H. Latham released (later Collector of the State tax for P. G. County) that he had received interest on interest upon said tax from the inhabitants of said County at upon and that he would receive none, released him from the State tax payment of said interest.

May 1st 1845

Remission of fine referred S. Sweeney, upon Thomas Frost for selling goods without license

May 3rd 1845

E. Everett & others referred The Gov. This day refused to grant a Nolle prosequi to Edward Everett and others indicted by Queen Anne County Court for assault & battery.

May 6th 1845

Remission of fine granted W. Sweeney Justice Peace Balt. City for selling goods without license

Account of Illinois referred The Gov. This day commissioned John B. Cherry to take a true and correct account of seeds for this State in the State of Illinois.

Comptroler of the referred The Gov. This day appointed Commissioners to lay off the wards of Baltimore (City) in conformity with the provisions of the Act of Dec. Session 1844 Chapter 282.

Warrant for delivery referred The Gov. This day upon the requisition of the Gov. of New York for the delivery to his Agent of Francis Brown charged with the crime of grand Larceny issued his Warrant for the delivery of the said Francis Brown to William D. Stephens Agent named in said requisition.

May 20th 1845

Remission of fine referred The Gov. This day refused to remit the fine imposed by D. Sweeney Justice Peace Balt. City upon Thos. Morry for selling goods without license.

J. Minnix referred The Gov. This day issued an order to the Clerk of the Levy Court of Balt. County for the admission of Teresa Minnix into the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf & Dumb.

Elizabeth referred The Gov. This day issued an order to the Clerk of Frederick County Court for the admission of Elizabeth Prodrick into the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf & Dumb.
