

May 22nd 1845

Howell The Gov. This day upon the recommendation of the Judges of P. G. County Court remitted the recognizance forfeited by Susanna Howell and Nordicia Burgess at April Term 1843 -

May 24th 1845

McCauley The Gov. This day upon the application of the Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary granted a pardon to Thomas McCauley whose term of service would have expired on the 30th of August 1845 - see record of pardons

Campbell The Gov. This day refused to grant a pardon to Edward Campbell confined in the Penitentiary

May 26th 1845

Leaverton The Gov. This day upon the recommendation of the Dept. Attorney General and various Citizens of Talbot County granted a pardon to John Leaverton who was convicted of Assault & Battery fined and sentenced to Jail - see record of pardons

The Gov. This day upon the requisition of the Gov. of Kentucky for the delivery to his Agent of Henry Jatto and George Meyers alias William Russell charged with the crime of Grand Larceny issued his warrant for the delivery of the said Henry Jatto & George Meyers alias William Russell Simon Hays and John Ryell Agents named in said requisition

June 2nd 1845

The Gov. This day issued a requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension and delivery of Simon Joel who was convicted in Carroll County Court for Grand Larceny. Joseph Brown the Agent for receiving him is to pay the costs

Pirley The Gov. This day upon the recommendation of the Judges of Worcester County Court remitted \$50 it being one half of a fine of fine imposed by said Court upon David Pirley for selling whiskey to free Negroes & Slaves on the Sabbath

June 11th 1845

The Gov. This day refused to remit a fine imposed by Carroll County Court upon Peter Lippy in 1844 for selling without License

The Gov. This day refused to pardon Lucas a Convict in the Penitentiary whose petition had been presented to Gov. Thomas and refused not acted on by him.

The Gov. This day refused to pardon sundry Citizens of Talbot County who had been sentenced to Jail

June 16th 1845

The Gov. This day upon the requisition of the Gov. of Pennsylvania issued his warrant to the Jailor of Bath City for the delivery of John Robinson charged with the crime of Grand Larceny to James Young the Agent named to receive him - he paying the costs of arrest
