Also against James H. Price Collector 7th District Cecil County for the year 1843. amount due \$1,759.97. Also against Joseph Wingate Collector 6th District Cecil Co. for the year 1843 - amount due \$1,337.19.

Collector

Baltimore County

The Gov. This day directed George R. Richardson Attorney General to bring suit against Samuel Matthews Collector of State tax 11th District Baltimore County for the year 1841. amount due \$786.24.

July 7th 1845-

Henry

McCurry

The Gov. This day received a letter from the Sheriff of Baltimore County informing him of the execution of Henry McCurry on the 27th June in conformity to the sentence.

July 9th 1845-

J. H. Parke

pardon refused to the Penitentiary

The Gov. This day refused to grant a pardon to John H. Parke convicted in Baltimore City Court June Term 1845 of grand Larceny and sentenced to the Penitentiary.

M. Essender

pardon granted

The Gov. This day upon the recommendation of the Attorney General and the Mayor of the City of Baltimore and various Citizens granted a pardon to William Essender convicted of Murder in Baltimore City Court June Term 1845 upon condition that he leave the State.

James

Crumer

pardon refused

The Gov. This day refused to grant a pardon to ^{Jonathan} George Crumer a convict of the Penitentiary sentenced by Frederick County Court. This pardon was afterwards granted. See Record of pardon July 14th 1845.

Collector

Cecil County

The Gov. This day upon the affidavit of George B. Pennington Collector of State tax for the 1st District Cecil County that he had received no interest upon the said tax from the inhabitants, released him from the payment of the same except so far as he may receive the said interest.

July 17th 1845-

William

Balder

pardon refused to the Penitentiary

The Gov. This day refused to grant a pardon to William Balder convicted in Baltimore City Court of Petty Larceny and sentenced to the Penitentiary.

July 21st 1845-

Requisition

from the Gov. of Delaware

The Gov. This day refused to deliver up Edward Salisbury and Benjamin Hanson upon the requisition of the Gov. of Delaware upon the ground that the affidavits do not charge any crimes to have been committed & the Laws of Delaware do not make the acts set forth a crime. This requisition was afterwards issued.

A. Payne

pardon refused

The Gov. This day refused to grant a pardon to George A. Payne convicted in P. C. County Court April Term 1845 of grand Larceny and sentenced to the Penitentiary.
