Election

November the 17th 1845

The Gov. This day sent the following certificates to the Members elect of Congress, also a copy to the Secretary of State of the United States -
State of Maryland to wit:

Whereas, An election was held on Wednesday the first day of October 1845, in the several Congressional Districts of this State, as described by law, for Members to represent the State in the next Congress of the United States; And whereas it is made the duty of the Governor, after having ascertained the number of votes given for each person voted for and declared by proclamation the names of those duly elected, to transmit a certificate of said election to the Secretary of State of the United States, or other proper Officer authorized to receive the same, to be by him delivered to the House of Representatives in the Congress of the United States, when assembled; And whereas, the number of said votes has been ascertained and proclamation made accordingly,

Now Therefore, I, Tho^s G. Pratt, Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby certify, that by the returns of the said Election in the several Counties of this State, made agreeably to law, it appears that John G. Chapman of the first District, Thomas Perry of the second District, J. Mathias Ligon of the third District, William J. Giles of the fourth District, Albert Constable of the fifth District, & Edward Long of the sixth District, had the highest number of votes in their respective Districts, and were duly elected Members to represent this State in the next Congress of the United States -
