for Negro E. Bell It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that Enock G. Bell a free man of colour stands charged by an indictment of the Grand Jury of A. A. County Court at April Term 1846 with the crime of enticing and assisting to run away a certain slave therein named the property of Tho<sup>s</sup>: G. Pratt and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the Justice of this State and has taken refuge within the District of Columbia.

Now therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such cases made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Enock G. Bell be apprehended & delivered to Madison Jeffers who is hereby duly authorized to receive & convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

W. Henderson The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Baltimore City Court granted a pardon to William Henderson convicted in said Court of assault with intent to kill upon condition of his paying the costs which have accrued in said case - see record of pardons.

B. Meeker The Governor this day rejected the application of Benjamin Meeker pardoned convicted at the June term of Baltimore City Court 1843 of grand larceny and sentenced to the penitentiary for three years.
