F. Jones of North Carolina who stands charged by indictment of the Grand Jury of Prince Georges County in this State at April Term 1846 for the crime of killing in a duel at Bladensburg in said County a certain Daniel E. Johnson

The Governor this day refused to grant a Nolle Prosequi to G. Beale (free Negro of Mathias City) who stands indicted in Anne Arundel County Court at April Term 1846 for the crime of cutting away slaves

The Gov. this day upon the affidavit of John B. Slemmons charging Matthew W. Chesney & John T. Hildrette with the crime of uttering a forged Draft & obtaining fraudulently thereon the sum of \$5000 from the Bank of Salisbury, issued a Warrant upon the Gov. of New York for the apprehension & delivery to Gilbert F. Hays - the Agent appointed to receive & convey them to this State for trial -

C. Waples

The Governor this day upon information received from H. N. Freeman a Justice of the Peace of Charles County who acted as Coroner, that a murder had been committed in said County upon the body of Jesse Cook by a Negro man named George, a Slave of J. S. Bowling of Prince Georges County; issued the following Proclamation -
