

September 26th 1846

Commission
The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the judges
of Cecil County Court remitted the forfeited recognizance of Robert
Watson Watson in the sum of \$50 for his non appearance at October Court
1840 also the fine of 50 cts imposed upon him at Oct. Court 1844.

September 30th 1846

Shade
The Governor this day refused to grant a pardon to Philip Shade
convicted in Baltimore City Court at June Term 1846 of Burglary and
refused sentenced to the Penitentiary.

September 30th 1846

Stonewifer
The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Judges
Bremer & sundry Citizens of Carroll County remitted a fine of forty
dollars imposed upon Harry Stonewifer for taking the acknowledgements
of Deeds contrary to the Act of Assembly in such cases made and
provided.

September 30th 1846

Wheat
The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the judges
of Kent County Court granted a pardon to Thomas Wheat convicted
in said Court at March Term 1846 of Assault & Battery with
intent to kill & sentenced to confinement in the County Jail
see record of pardons

October 9th 1846

Clark
The Governor this day granted a pardon to Mr. Clark alias
Mr. Clark Cochran convicted in Baltimore City Court at September
Term 1846 of the crime of obtaining goods under false pretences,
it being recommended by the Judges see record of pardons.

October 3rd 1846

Requisition
The Governor this day issued a requisition upon the
Governor for the apprehension & delivery of David Hooper who
stands charged as Indictment in Baltimore City Court of
the crime of obtaining goods under false pretences -
Nicholas Burkes Agent to receive him who is to
discharge the duty free of cost to the State

A Proclamation

Whereas, it has been customary for the Executive of this
State, to assign annually a day to be observed by her Citizens, as a day
of public worship, prayer & thanksgiving to Almighty God, for the
civil and religious privileges, and the many blessings, individual
and National, which it has pleased him to bestow upon them -
And Whereas, the proper observance of such a
day, by the assembling of the people of every religious persuasion,
to offer up their united prayers for the continuance of the
blessings and privileges enjoyed by them, and to hear from their
Pastors and Ministers, the great religious truths, that the duty
they owe to their Country is one of the first duties they
