The Governor this day offered the custody of the Great Seal to Thomas S. Alexander Esq. as Chancellor of the State of Maryland in the place of Theodorick Blair deceased.

The Governor this day received a communication from Thomas S. Alexander Esq. declining to accept the office of Custody of the Great Seal as the Chancellor of the State.

The Governor this day addressed a communication to Geo. W. Mason Esq. offering to him the custody of the Great Seal as Chancellor of the State of Maryland (see letter book)

The Governor this day rejected the petition of Rosanna M. Hennard convicted in Baltimore City Court at September Term 1846 of assault with intent to kill, and sentenced to imprisonment for six months also a fine of \$100. This pardon was granted on the 11<sup>th</sup> Jan. 1847. see record of pardons Nov. 21<sup>st</sup> 1846

Hill  
The Governor this day rejected the application for pardon of Stephen Hill (Negro) convicted in Baltimore City Court at October Term 1846 of stealing

The Governor this day in obedience to a requisition from the Governor of Delaware issued a warrant to the Sheriff of Cecil County for the delivery of John Smith to (Geo. W. Platt) Agent, said Smith being charged upon indictment with the crime of Murder
