House of Delegates

I transmit for your consideration, another communication received by me this morning from the Secretary of War, upon the subject of the cession by this State to the United States of Jurisdiction over Sollers Point & late for the creation of Fortifications at that point.

Since my last communication to you upon this subject, I forwarded to the Secretary of War, an authenticated copy of the laws of the last Session, which was designed to make to the United States the cession of the required Jurisdiction over the point designated.

This present communication of the Secretary of War points out the objections to that law, and asks such additional Legislation as will remove those objections - I must solicit for this subject your early consideration -
