

February 5th 1847

Resolved, That his Excellency the Governor, be requested to cause the National Flag to be displayed at half Mast from the State House Steeple during the day of the funeral and that he direct guns to be fired between the hours of 12 noon & 3 o'clock, at intervals of every half hour during the march of the procession.

The Legislature having passed the above resolution on Feb. 3rd 1847 in honour of the memory of Lt. Col. Waters and Capt. Mandolph Bridgely the Gov. issues the following order to the Adjt. Genl.

The Governor this day transmitted the following resolutions to each of the Senators & Representatives in the Congress of the United States.

By the House of Delegates

Jan. 18th 1847

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that our Senators and Representatives in Congress, be requested to use their efforts to obtain an appropriation for building a Light Boat of a suitable size, to be stationed on the Severn foot wharf in the Chesapeake Bay, near the mouth of the Patuxent River, for a Light House on Greenburys Point at the mouth of the harbour of Annapolis River, and also for a Light House on Flat Cap at the mouth of Annapisset River.

Resolved further, that his Excellency the Governor be requested to forward a copy of the foregoing resolutions to our Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States.
