

April 21st 1847

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the judges of P. G. County remitted a fine of fifty dollars imposed by said Court upon Walter M. Berry for selling to Negroes after hour set

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the judges of Baltimore County Court remitted a fine of twenty dollars imposed by said Court upon Meredith Smith Meredith for selling liquor upon the Sabbath

April 26th 1847

The Governor this day issued a requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension & delivery (to John Zell Agent) of Isaac Brown who stands charged upon the affidavit of Alexander Somerville with the crime of an assault with intent to kill him - A second requisition issued in this case to the same agent on the 11th of May 1847 -

The Governor this day refused to grant a pardon to John Vermillion convicted in Prince Georges County Court of the crime of stealing three Bee Hives the property of Samuel Peck

April 27th 1847

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the Judges of Kent County Court granted a pardon to Jim Browne convicted in said Court at September Term 1846 of Assault & Battery & sentenced to confinement in the County Jail - see record of pardons

May 10th 1847

The Gov. this day upon the recommendation of the Jury & Judges of Baltimore County Court granted a pardon to Conaco Prince (convicted in said Court of Manslaughter & sentenced to the Penitentiary) - see record of pardons

May 4th 1847

The Governor this day in obedience to a requisition from the Gov. of Pennsylvania issued a warrant to the Sheriff of Frederick County for the apprehension & delivery (to George Hughes Agent) of John Morgan alias James Horton who stands charged upon the affidavit of John Meider with the crime of Horse Stealing

The Gov. this day upon the recommendation of the Judges of Baltimore County Court remitted a fine of ~~two~~ dollars imposed upon Alfred M. Clasthey for selling liquor without license - also released him from imprisonment for assault & Battery

May 5th 1847

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the Judges of Baltimore City Court granted a pardon to Philip Made convicted in said Court of the crime of Burglary and sentenced to the Penitentiary - see record of pardons upon the condition that he leave the State & do not return thereto
