### Proclamation

Executive Department  
October 10<sup>th</sup> 1847

negroes

Whereas, it has been represented to me that two Negroes named Moses and Edward charged with the crime of burning the Barn of Solomon G. Chaney of Anne Arundel County some time in the summer of 1847 have fled from the justice of this State

I do therefore at the instance of many citizens of said County by this my proclamation offer a reward of two hundred dollars for the apprehension & delivery of said Negroes, to the Sheriff of Anne Arundel County at Annapolis -

Moses is about six feet high, 40 years old, bright Mulatto and rather slender built -

Edward is about 5 feet 11 inches high, 33 or 34 years old, stout built and dark chestnut colour -

The Governor this day issued an order for the admission of Sarah E. Duley of Baltimore City into the Pennsylvania jurisdiction for the Police
