

February 23<sup>rd</sup> 1848.

The Governor this day nominated to the Senate the list of Civil appointments for Talbot County.

The Governor nominated to the Senate certain Military Officers in the 1<sup>st</sup> Light Brigade Cavalry Regiment of the Baltimore Volunteers. And also in the 5<sup>th</sup> Cavalry Regiment of Maryland Militia

The Governor nominated to the Senate Francis Mezeck as an additional Justice of the Peace for Worcester County.

The Governor refused to grant a Pardon to Lewis H. Cummins convicted of Manslaughter in Baltimore City Court.

The Governor remitted the forfeited recognizance of John Angle of Washington County; and also that of William Gray of Montgomery County.

The Governor received a communication from the Senate informing him that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the list of Civil Officers heretofore nominated by him for Howard District, Montgomery, St. Marys, Washington, Dorchester and Baltimore Counties; and also to the appointment of the additional list of Civil Officers nominated by him for Prince Georges County.

Commissions were issued to the Civil Officers appointed for St. Marys and Montgomery Counties; and to the Justices of the Peace, the Coroners and the Surveyor appointed for Dorchester County.

February 24<sup>th</sup> 1848.

The Governor this day nominated to the Senate James O. McCormick for Inspector of Quans in the City of Baltimore.

Commissions were issued for the Justices of the Orphans Court of Dorchester County. For the Civil Officers appointed for Howard District, for Washington, Baltimore and Prince Georges County.

On the recommendation of George B. Richardson Esq. Attorney General of the State of Maryland, the Governor granted a Nolle Prosequi to John D. Ott and John A. Treasurer of Washington County, who are Indicted for a Libel on William B. Clark Esq. Deputy Attorney General for the said County.

The Governor received the following communication from the House of Delegates.  
By the House of Delegates February 24<sup>th</sup> 1848. Ordered. That the Governor be requested to cause the National Flag to be hoisted at half mast on the State House until the funeral services of the Ex-President Adams are over.
