

February 26th 1848.

The Governor this day received from the Governor of Pennsylvania a requisition for John Moore alias Frosty a fugitive from justice of State. Whereupon the Governor issued his warrant to the Sheriff of Allegany County for the arrest and delivery up of the said fugitive.

February 28th 1848.

The Governor this day nominated to the Senate the Auctioneers for the City of Baltimore

The Governor sent to the Senate a communication asking a return of the nominations made by him on the 18th inst for Harford County.

The Governor received the official Bonds of Jno Robinson and Charles Cole appointed Notaries Public at Frederick City, and approved the same.

The Governor received from the Senate a communication informing him that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the list of Civil Officers nominated by him for Talbot and Worcester Counties; also to the appointment of the Auctioneers nominated by him for Baltimore. And the Senate at the same time returned to the Governor the list of nominations made by him for Harford County as requested in his communication of to day.

Commissions were issued for the Civil Officers appointed for Talbot County, excepting the Justices of the Orphans Court.

February 29th 1848.

Commissions were issued for the Civil Officers appointed for Worcester County and for the Justices of the Orphans Court of Talbot County.

The Governor this day sent a communication to the Senate returning the list of Civil nominations for Harford County, having added thereto the names of Thomas Luter and Daniel Whiteford as Justices of the Peace. The Governor also nominated to the Senate the list of Civil Officers for Cecil County, and an additional list of Civil Officers for Washington County.

March 1st 1848.

The Governor this day nominated to the Senate the List of Civil Officers for Allegany County.

The Governor received the official Bond of William D. Dorsey appointed Notary Public at Ellicotts Mills in Howard District and approved the same.

The Governor received a communication from the Senate informing him that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the list of Civil Officers nominated for Charles County excepting Richard A. Carver, Nathan S. Dent, William
