

The Governor appointed and commissioned Samuel Mefinger, Peter D. Mickell and William Tapp Justices of the District Court of the 3rd District in Carroll County, vice Hoons and Shriver declined and Mickell commissioned by the wrong name. He also appointed and commissioned John Hoons, George W. McDaniel, Thomas J. Carter, Allen Bennett, Levi F. Bennett and James Rodgers, Justices of the Peace in said County vice John Jones, Warner Gaitther, David Crumbarrow, William Frazier, George Shephard and Daniel Diehl declined serving.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned George Howard Hollingworth Adjutant of the 24th Regiment M. M. vice Hamilton declined. He also appointed and commissioned John Spencer 1st Lieut in Cavalry Company commanded by Capt Geo W. Spencer in the 8th Regimental Cavalry District Maryland Militia. June 15th 1848.

The Governor this day remitted the fines of Thirty dollars imposed by Baltimore City Court, at January Term 1848, for rioting on each of the following named persons. William Young, Henry Smith, William Hubbard, William McQuire, James Hollett, Randolph Stubbs, John W. Allee, Benjamin Clark and Charles Lockwood on condition of the payment of the costs in each case by the respective parties thereto.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Charles E. Markland Associate Justice of the District Court of the 5th District in Harford County vice A. D. Lindsey appointed chief Justice of said Court.

The Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Julius C. Davis of Somerset County who was indicted in Baltimore City Court by the name of John H. alias Thomas Davis for stealing a cloak the property of one H. J. Dodder he having been recommended to executive clemency by very many respectable citizens of Baltimore City and Somerset County.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Thomas W. Leans Justice of the Peace in the 7th District of Cecil County vice William C. Blackstone who declined serving.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Henry L. P. Key, chief Justice of the Orphans Court of St. Marys County vice Miles declined.

The Governor appointed and commissioned John H. Fisher Justice of the Peace in Somerset County vice W. Borten declined.
