

John M. Allsee, Benjamin Black and Charles Lockwood, to the extent of the interest of the State therein, they being represented as unable to comply with the conditions upon which the remission of the 16th Inst was made.

June 24th 1848.

The Governor this day issued a duplicate commission to John D. Henderson as Surveyor of Harford County, his former commission either not having reached the Office of the Clerk of Harford County Court or having been there mislaid.

June 26th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Matthias J. Kaldenbach Justice of the District Court of the 4th District in Prince George's County vice Eversfield declined to serve. He also appointed and commissioned John W. Pimmon Justice of the Peace in Calvert County vice Anderson who declined to serve.

The Governor rejected the application for the pardon of James King a free negro convicted of Felony in Frederick County Court.

The Governor granted a pardon to John Linton convicted in Baltimore City Court of the robbery of J. S. Nicholson, who has recommended the said Linton to Executive clemency. He also granted a pardon to John Dean convicted in Washington County Court of Felony.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William L. Howard, Samuel P. Denton and David Thomas Justices of the District Court of the Seventh District in Frederick County, the said District being a new District laid off under the Act of Assembly of December session last 1847 chapter 147.

He also appointed and commissioned Samuel Johnson and Levin S. M. P. Brodwater Justices of the District Court of the Second District in Worcester County vice Sturgis and Wellbourne who declined to serve.

The Governor issued the following requisition to the Governor of the State of New York for the apprehension and delivery up of one Ira Mabbett a fugitive from the justice of this State.

State of Maryland, to wit:

Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland.

To his Excellency the Governor of New York.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that Ira Mabbett stands charged on the oath of John Honeywell with embezzling, on the oath of Charles Marshall with feloniously stealing the sum of five dollars the property of one John Marshall, and also on the oath of John D. Egerton with obtaining under false pretences a package of Lottery Tickets of the value of five hundred and twenty dollars the property of the said Egerton and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and taken refuge within the State of New York.
