

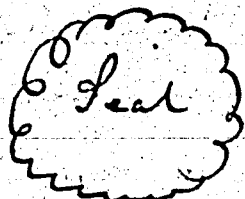

July 3rd 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned the Hon Thomas Beale Dorsey Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals of the State of Maryland vice the Hon Stevenson Archer deceased; Whereupon a commission was issued to him in the following words to wit:
State of Maryland. To the Hon Thomas Beale Dorsey Chief Judge of the Third Judicial District of Maryland, Greeting:

Be it known, that reposing great trust and confidence in your integrity and sound legal knowledge, you are appointed and assigned Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals, to do equal right and justice according to law, in every case in which you shall act as such Judge, freely without sale, fully without denial and speedily without delay; and you are to execute the said office of Chief Judge, honestly, diligently and faithfully, according to law; and you are to hold and execute the said office for and during good behaviour, and removable only in the manner prescribed by the Constitution and Form of Government.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William Frick Esq Chief Judge of the Sixth Judicial District of Maryland vice the Hon Stevenson Archer deceased; whose commission was issued in the following words to wit:

State of Maryland, To William Frick Esquire Greeting:

Be it known, that reposing great trust and confidence in your integrity and sound legal knowledge, you are appointed and assigned Chief Judge of the Sixth Judicial District, to do equal right and justice according to law, in every case in which you shall act as Judge, freely without sale, fully without denial and speedily without delay; and you are to hold and execute the said office for and during your good behaviour, and removable only in the manner prescribed by the Constitution and Form of Government.
