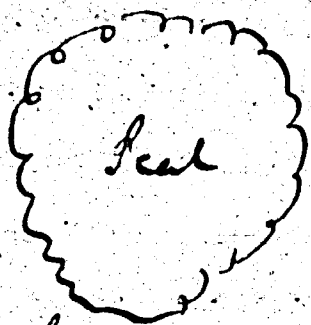

July 10th 1848.

\$200. Reward.

Whereas it has been represented to the Governor of the State of Maryland, that the dead body of an unknown stranger was recently found in Harford County about seven miles from Belair, who is supposed to have come to a violent end and to have been murdered by a person or persons unknown.

And whereas it has been requested on behalf of sundry citizens of Harford County that a reward be offered for the apprehension and conviction of the murderer or murderers of the said stranger.

Now therefore I, Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland to the end that the perpetrator or perpetrators of this murder may be discovered and brought to punishment, do offer a reward of two hundred dollars for the discovery apprehension and conviction of the perpetrator or perpetrators of the said murder.
