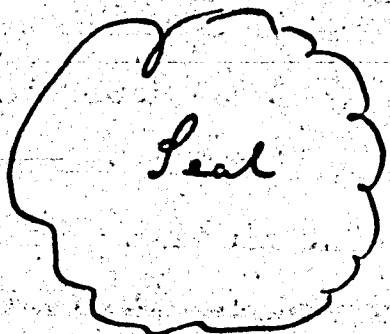




In witness whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name

August 3rd 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Levi Otto
captain, John Horner 1st Lieut and Thomas Browning 2nd Lieut in the Company of "Moun-
-tain Rangers". Joseph Forsyth 1st Lieut and Samuel Luter 2nd Lieut in Company No 5.
Dominick Mattingly 1st Lieut and James Browning 2nd Lieut in Company No 7. Henry A. Ham-
-mill and John Morrison 2nd Lieut in Company No 8. Lloyd Lowe 1st Lieut and Walter
Devans jun 2nd Lieut in Company No 11. all of the 50th Regiment Maryland Militia.

The Governor appointed and commissioned David Hays
Justice of the Peace in Carroll County vice John H. Blabough declined, and Rich-
-ard Harris Associate Justice of District Court No 8 in said County vice John Bank-
-sider resigned.

August 4th 1848.

The Governor this day remitted the amount of interest due by
Henry Dusey, Collector of State Tax in Baltimore County for the year 1846. The said
collector having set forth in his affidavit filed that he has not collected or received
any interest on the said State Tax, and he having also heretofore settled up his ac-
-counts as collector at the State Treasury.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Robert H. Dusey,
William H. Dullam and Michael E. Dew Justices of the Magistrates Court in the third
District of Harford County vice Michem, Bond and Heman declined. He also appointed
and commissioned Thomas L. Stump Justice of the Peace in said County vice William
Hays declined.

August 5th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John W. Wagner
captain of the "Baltimore Invincibles" 53rd Regiment of Maryland Volunteer Infantry
vice Anderson promoted. He also appointed and commissioned Isaac Morrow 1st
Lieut vice Lefkman resigned and Henry M. Milnor 2nd Lieut vice Morrow promoted.
in the Light Battery attached to the District of Columbia and Maryland Regiment com-
-manded by Col George W. Hughes, each to take rank from the 16th day of May 1848.

The Governor rejected the application of C. P. Williams for the remission
of a fine imposed on him by Charles County Court.
