

The Governor appointed and commissioned Larkin Buckingham Justice of the Peace in Carroll County vice Franklin declined.

August 8th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Solomon Betts Captain, Luther H. Sparks 1st Lieut and Joshua S. Coaden 2nd Lieut of 1st Troop "Washington Blues" attached to the 9th Cavalry Regiment M. M. And James W. Price Ensign of the "Independent Blues" of same Cavalry Regiment.

August 10th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John A. Leonard Col. John H. Winemiller Lt Col and John Broadbent Major of 1st Regiment, Volunteer Mounted Riflemen in Montgomery County attached to 7th Brigade 1st Division M. M.

The Governor appointed and commissioned George B. Howard Colonel vice Howland resigned. Richard C. Hollyday Lieut Colonel vice Howard promoted and Francis A. Ellis Major vice Chambers resigned in 49th Regiment M. M. He also appointed and commissioned Jacob Reedy Captain vice Phinney promoted, Daniel Smith 3rd Lieut vice Reedy promoted and Josephus W. Wise Ensign vice Smith promoted in 28th Regiment M. M.

August 11th 1848.

The Governor this day on the recommendation of the Hon E. F. Chamber granted a Nolle Prosequi to negro Henry slave of Josias Ringgold of Kent County charged with an Assault and Battery with the intent to kill William Webb.

August 19th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Alfred A. Duhamel 1st Lieut, John Lewis Rolph 2nd Lieut and Zenas Dawson Ensign in 1st Troop, the "True Republican Blues" commanded by Capt R. E. C. Downes attached to the 9th Cavalry Regiment M. M.

August 21st 1848.

The Governor this day issued the following requisition to the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania.

State of Maryland to wit:

Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland.

To his Excellency, the Governor of Pennsylvania.

It appears by the annexed Papers, duly authenticated according to the Laws of this State, that a certain George Lewis a free negro on or about the twentieth day of July last stole from a certain Edward Wagoner of Baltimore County in this State a bay mare aged nine years the property of the said Edward Wagoner, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania.
