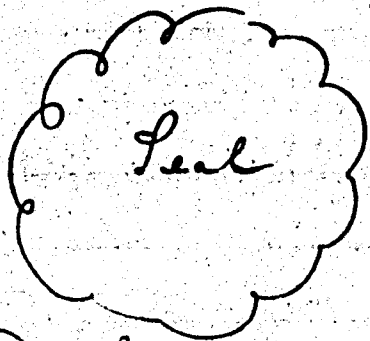

August 25th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John Marshall Captain of the "Junior Artillery" Company A. 1st Regiment of Light Artillery Maryland Volunteers vice S. L. D. Gill resigned, and John A. Durst 3rd Lieut of same Company vice W. S. Gittings resigned.

August 28th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John H. Stewart 1st Lieut vice C. R. Hooper resigned, and Hugh S. Muir 3rd Lieut vice James Moore resigned in the Dorchester Troop of Horse attached to the 10th Regimental Cavalry District Maryland Militia.

The Governor on the recommendation of a number of respectable citizens of Anne Arundel County granted a Nolle Prosequi to John Deale who was in jail on the charge of Felony.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Allen Prigg Justice of the Peace in Cecil County vice Thomas W. Dean who declined serving. He also appointed and commissioned Francis R. Speake Associate Justice of the District Court in the 1st District in Charles County vice F. P. Brown declined. He also appointed and commissioned Joel Hall, James Hannan and Reuben Falkner Justice of the District Court in the 9th District of Frederick County; the justices appointed in said District having refused to serve. He also appointed and commissioned John Arthur Associate Justice of the District Court in the 4th District of Frederick County vice Metcalf declined. He also appointed and commissioned Andrew Durr Associate Justice of the District Court of the 4th District in Baltimore County vice Beckley declined.

The Governor approved the Official Bond of Dennis Bland the Treasurer of the State of Maryland, which was filed.

August 30th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned George Gibbons Auctioneer in Baltimore City.
