

The Governor appointed and commissioned James P. Phillips Justice of the Peace in Somerset County vice Ward declined. He also appointed and commissioned Absalom Larrison, John A. Burroughs and John P. Turner Justices of the District Court in 2nd District of Charles County vice the former appointees who refused to serve.

August 31st 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Walter M. Miller Col in 43rd Regiment M. M. vice Francis Thompson resigned. He also appointed and commissioned William Roe Captain, Thomas F. Jackson 1st Lieut and John Hudson 2nd Lieut in Company No 3. attached to the Extra Battalion M. M. Caroline County. And also David Knotts Captain and William Wilkinson 1st Lieut in Company No 5. "Independent Guards" Uniform Company attached to the Extra Battalion M. M. in Caroline County.

September 4th 1848

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William Foush Justice of the Peace in Baltimore County vice Thomas Croft declined.

The Governor transmitted to John T. D. Dorsey Esq. Deputy Attorney General for Howard District the following accounts for collection. An Account due by Milton Welch Collector of State Taxes for Howard District for the year 1843 for the sum of \$709.62cts principal and interest, a second account due by the same Collector for the year 1844 for the sum of \$1151.41cts principal and interest. Also an account due by William H. Crawford Collector of State Taxes for said District for the year 1845 for the sum of \$1553.68cts principal and interest, and a second account due by the same Collector for the year 1846 for the sum of \$1500.06cts principal and interest. With instructions to the said Attorney to put in suit the Bonds of the said Collectors for the arrears of State Tax due by them.

September 5th 1848.

The Governor this day issued an order for the admission of Enoch P. Porter a deaf mute of Allegany County aged about eleven years, into the Institution for the Deaf and Dumb in Philadelphia.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Alexander Keech a Justice of the Levy Court in Prince Georges County vice Richard W. W. Bowie resigned.

September 6th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned George W. Ulbrick Inspector of Leather in Frederick City vice Bantz who has changed his residence. He also appointed and commissioned Andrew Kessler Jr Associate Justice of District Court of the 14th District of Frederick County vice Stockman declined.
