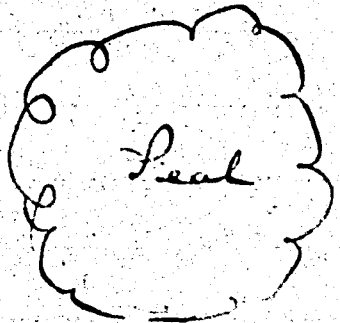


from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania

the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said
Alexander Moon be apprehended and delivered to John Graham who is hereby duly au-
thorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland then to be dealt with
according to Law.

The Governor appointed and commissioned by W. Goldsborough
Captains William Hardcastle 1st Lieut. and Charles Wyatt 2nd Lieut in Troop of Hores
attached to the 10th Regimental Cavalry District M. M. He also commissioned Charles H.
Wells Captain in 43rd Regiment M. M. vice J. H. Diggs removed from District, the commission
in this case bears date 26th September, having been omitted to be issued on that day.

October 27th 1848

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Samuel
E. Duvall vice Isaac G. Hopkins declined, Addison Johnson vice W. Williams declined
and Dorsey Jacob vice Joseph Arniger declined, Justices of the Peace in Anne Arundel
County. He also appointed and commissioned James D. Thompson vice Cyrus Bell
declined and James Gould vice John Prouse declined Justices of the Peace in Dorches-
ter County. And he also appointed and commissioned Philip G. Love Justice of
the Peace in St Marys County vice John T. Colton declined.

The Governor on the recommendation of Judge R. B. Marshall
remitted the forfeited recognizance of George Nichols of Frederick County.

The Governor received from the Governor of Pennsylvania
a requisition for the surrender of John S. Miller charged with Felony a fugitive
from justice he accordingly issued his warrant for the apprehension and sur-
render of the said fugitive.

The Governor on application of D. D. Hopper Jr granted a
Nolle Prosequi to Benjamin Thomas a negro slave charged with running away
from his master, on condition the said slave should be sold out of the State.

The Governor on recommendation of Jacob G. Davies remitted
a fine of fifteen dollars imposed by Baltimore City Court at May Term 1848
on Emanuel Stockett for assaulting George T. Mearge.
