

The Governor on the recommendation of numerous citizens of Baltimore City remitted the several fines imposed on James B. Jones by Baltimore City Court at the September Term 1848 of said Court.

November 2nd 1848.

The Governor this day on the report and recommendation of the Trustees of the Poor of Worcester County passed an order for the admission of John S. Jones an indigent blind boy of said County, into the Pennsylvania Institution for the Instruction of the Blind at Philadelphia.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Franklin Hopkins 1st Lieut vice Cox resigned, Edward Hutson 2nd Lieut vice Hopkins promoted, John Mortimer 2nd Lieut vice Hutson promoted and Daniel Constantine Ensign of the "Columbian Riflemen" 1st Rifle Regiment of Maryland Volunteers. He also appointed and commissioned John W. Davis 2nd Lieut vice Drum resigned, Lewis Gray 3rd Lieut vice Fitzpatrick resigned and John S. Ford Ensign vice Geo Smith resigned of the "Patapsco Riflemen" 1st Rifle Regiment of Maryland Volunteers.

The Governor on the recommendation of the Jury and other citizens of Baltimore City, granted a Pardon to Ann Matthews convicted in Baltimore City Court at September Term 1848.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Bennett Gilbert Chief Justice vice Thos Cord declined, and Thomas Cord Associate Justice vice Gilbert appointed Chief in the District Court of the 2nd District of Harford County.

November 3rd 1848.

The Governor this day remitted the fine of Ten dollars imposed on Mary Ann Sturley by Baltimore City Court at September Term 1848 for an assault and battery on Philip Wagner.

The Governor commissioned Thomas D. Dillingdale Sheriff of Calvert County.

The Governor appointed and commissioned George D. Gray Surveyor of Worcester County vice Lett M. Whaley resigned.

November 4th 1848.

The Governor this day remitted the several fines imposed on Edward Down and Ezekiel Steighe by Baltimore City Court at September Term 1848.

November 6th 1848.

The Governor this day refused to grant a Pardon to Owen Jones a convict in the Penitentiary.
