

November 7th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Thomas Sheppard
Adjutant of the 5th Regiment Volunteer Infantry vice F. Lucasi resigned.

November 9th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Charles
W. Lusby Auctioneer in Baltimore City vice C. W. Lusby who failed to take out his for-
mer commission

November 13th 1848.

The Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Jacob M.
Kunkel and Enoch Louis Lowe of Frederick County, who stood charged the one with
having sent a challenge and the other with having carried it, to Grayson Luchberger
to fight a duel.

November 21st 1848.

The Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Nicholas
Martin Jr of Talbot County charged with an assault and battery on John H. Craft.

November 22nd 1848.

The Governor this day on the recommendation of Judge Brain
remitted the forfeited recognizance of Bernard Kirby of Prince Georges County.

The Governor refused to grant a Nolle Prosequi to Noah Hartzok
of Frederick County, who stands charged with Bigamy.

The Governor issued the following Proclamation.
"A Proclamation by the Governor of Maryland."

State of Maryland, to wit:

Whereas, returns have been received by me from
the Judges of Election in the several Counties of the State and of the City of Baltimore
of an election held on Tuesday the seventh day of the present month for Electors of
President and Vice President of the United States: And whereas the number of votes
given for each person voted for as such have been carefully ascertained by me.

Now, therefore, I Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland
in pursuance of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided, do by this my Pro-
clamation declare that William Linsan Gauthier, Joseph S. Cottman, John M. S. Cairns, Jacob
Philip Roman, Andrew G. Ege, James Morrison Harris, Benjamin Chambers Wickes and John
C. Dickinson Esquires appear by said returns to have received the highest number of votes in
the State of Maryland and are duly elected Electors of President and Vice President of the
United States.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State
of Maryland this twenty second day of November in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty eight.
