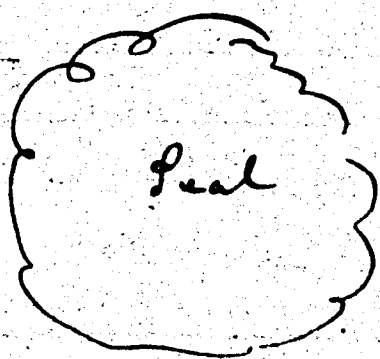




Given under my hand and the Great Seal

December 9th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Thomas
Lemmon Justice of the Peace in Baltimore County vice John G. Day who has
failed to qualify.

The Governor on the recommendation of Judge Train remitted
the forfeited recognizances of Priscilla Tomerville, James M. Combs and Cornelius
F. Kirby of St. Marys County.

December 12th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Richard
H. Mitchell and Elijah W. Day Justices of the Peace in Charles County vice Diggs
removed from the County and Davis appointed Post Master.

December 13th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Charles M.
Callister Chief and Samuel R. Oldson Associate Justice of District Court No. 2. in
Queen Anne's County vice Green resigned and McCallister appointed Chief.

December 14th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William W.
Meeks Sergeant Major of the 5th Regiment Maryland Volunteer Infantry and Joseph
Groninger 3rd Lieut of "First Baltimore German Guards" 5th Regiment Maryland Volunteer
Infantry vice A. Kroft resigned.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William Marshall
Auctioneer in the City of Baltimore.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Alexander E. Popper
Justice of the Peace in Montgomery County vice Lannan removed from the County.

December 22nd 1848

The Governor this day on the recommendation of the Judges remitted
the fine of fifty dollars imposed on Eric Lichelberger of Washington County at the
November Term 1848 of Washington County Court.
