January 1st 1849.

The Governor this day reappointed and recommissioned Louis Gapaway Register in Chancery, his former commission having expired on the 31st of December 1848.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Lemuel E. Duvall Notary Public to reside in Baltimore City vice Lyde Goodwin W. Blair resigned.

January 4th 1849.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned George W. Pembroke Surveyor of St. Marys County vice Benjamin Tippet declined. He also appointed and commissioned Absalom Deall and Robert Brown Justices of the Peace in Montgomery County vice W. Butcher declined and Higgins resigned.

January 5th 1849.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William Jordan William H. Dallam, and Merrick D. Cunningham Justices of the Court of the third District in Harford County vice Dufey, Dallam and Tew declined. He also appointed and commissioned Jacob Musellen Justice of the Peace in Allegany County vice John Wright declined.
