

The Governor appointed and commissioned William B. Ferguson Commissioner of Deeds to reside in California.

The Governor granted a Pardon to Joseph Halfen convicted of Felony in Baltimore City Court, having been recommended to Executive clemency by the Judges of the Court and other respectable citizens.

January 26th 1849.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned James McCallough Jacob Rhule and Caleb Freeland Justices of the District Court in the sixth District of Baltimore County vice McCallough, Hoshall and Nelson declined.

The Governor appointed and commissioned John J. Burge Justice of the Peace in Somerset County vice Bounds declined.

The Governor on the recommendation of the Judges of Baltimore City Court granted a Pardon to Jacob Kenerwell convicted of Felony in said Court.

January 27th 1849.

The Governor this day on the requisition of the Governor of New York issued his warrant to the Sheriffs of Baltimore City and County for the arrest and delivery up of William Haywood alias William Thompson and William Dargy fugitives from the justice of that State.

January 29th 1849.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Joseph L. Chester Commissioner of Deeds in Philadelphia.

January 30th 1849.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Daniel Robinsons Justice of the Peace in Dorchester County vice Daniel Robertson, the being incorrect in the former commission.

The Governor granted a Pardon to Frederick Bloomer convicted of Felony in Baltimore City Court, having been recommended to Executive clemency by the Court the Jury, the Mayor of the City and other respectable citizens on the condition however that the said Bloomer should enlist in the naval service of the United States.

January 31st 1849.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Peace Brown Col of 20th Regiment M. M. vice Thomas Lappington stricken off, not having reported according to Law.
