June 21st 1849
The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the Deputy of the Attorney General for Montgomery County and many of the most respectable citizens of that county remitted the two fines of ten dollars each imposed on Henry B. Dady by Montgomery County Court at November Term 1848 in two cases marked N. 22 and N. 23 criminal proceedings for an assault and battery.

June 22nd 1849
The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the panel of Jurors who convicted him, of eleven of the panel of Jurors who sat upon his first trial, of twenty one of the Grand Jurors who presented him, and of many of the most respectable citizens of the City of Baltimore pardoned John Drown convicted at the May Term 1849 of Baltimore City Court of Manslaughter upon condition that he pay the entire amount of costs of the trial which resulted in his conviction (see record of Drown's case)

June 25th 1849
The Governor this day upon being made acquainted with the fact that the costs exceed five hundred dollars in the case of John Drown convicted in Baltimore City Court at May Term 1849 of Manslaughter and to whom he had granted a pardon on condition of payment of costs which was issued on the twenty second instant, granted to him another pardon for the same offence without any conditions being appended thereto.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Robert W. Brock a Justice of the Peace for Prince George's County vice Com. A. Sartre resigned.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Crain and of many respectable citizens of Charles County, remitted the forfeited recognizance of William Holmes principal and James B. C. Latimer and Walter Woods his sureties for his appearance before Charles County Court at August Term 1842

June 26. 1849
The Governor this day appointed and commissioned J. Henry Hill Commissioner to take the acknowledgment of deeds to reside in Worcester County Massachusetts; also appointed and commissioned Moses Gray Palmer
