The Governor made the following communication to the House of Delegates  
January 19th 1850

To the House of Delegates:

I herewith transmit the accompanying resolutions of the General Assembly of the State of Connecticut just received at this department from the Executive of that State on the subject of Slavery in the Territories of the United States and the District of Columbia

The Governor upon the recommendation of the directors of the penitentiary ordered Henry Mendickall indicted at the March term 1847 of Washington County Court and sentenced to serve and labor in the penitentiary for five years and two months

The Governor appointed and commissioned Albert Constable Esquire Counsel to defend Jonathan Little a citizen of Maryland now confined in the jail of Huntingdon County Pennsylvania upon the charge of kidnapping as authorized by the resolutions of the General Assembly passed at December Session a fifteen hundred and forty nine

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of James Bamum and other respectable citizens of the city of Baltimore granted a writ peremptory to Samuel D. Kearney alias James H. Askey, indicted in Baltimore city court for receiving fifty dollars under false pretences from the said James Bamum
