

19<sup>th</sup> August 1850

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of many respectable citizens of the city of Baltimore pardoned Jackson Kelly convicted in Baltimore city court on Saturday the 15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1850 of an assault and battery and sentenced to be confined in Baltimore city and County jail for thirty days and to pay a fine of ten dollars and costs.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Baltimore remitted thirty five dollars of the fine of fifty dollars imposed upon Lewis J. Bailey by Calvert County Court at May Term 1850 for permitting a negro to be in his store hours between sunset and sunrise

21<sup>st</sup> August 1850

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of many respectable citizens of Baltimore city pardoned Rosanna Herbert convicted at November term 1844 of Baltimore city Court of murder in the 2<sup>nd</sup> degree and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary until the second day of August 1857

28<sup>th</sup> August 1850

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Nathaniel S. Walker Captain James H. McComas 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant, Aloysius St. Baugurger 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant, Joseph Scott 3<sup>rd</sup> Lieutenant and St. Clay Med. Surg. and Major of Baltimore city Riflemen 1<sup>st</sup> Regt. 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt. Colonel 1<sup>st</sup> Light division M. U.

The Governor upon the recommendation of the jury by whom they were tried and convicted and by many of the most respectable citizens of the city of Baltimore pardoned James and John Cochran convicted on indictments in Baltimore city court at May term 1850 of Conspiracy and sentenced to be imprisoned one year and to be fined each \$100. and also remitted the fine in each case.

The Governor granted a Writ *prosequi* to hold in Kent slave of James Hunt for an assault and battery with intent to kill one negro man named Charles committed in Calvert County on or about the 7<sup>th</sup> May 1850.

4<sup>th</sup> September 1850

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Henry A. Thompson Captain General 1<sup>st</sup> Brigade of Artillery composed of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiments of Artillery attached to 3<sup>rd</sup> Division M. U.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Joseph Dilley to be superintendent of the National Road vice John Swan deceased.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Alexander de Beas Commissioner of deeds to reside at New Orleans Louisiana
