16th December 1850

The Governor this day increased the number of the Committee on the Industrial Exhibition to be held in London in May 1851 by adding thereto the name of John Elliott of the city of Baltimore.

17th December 1850

The Governor this day issued the following death warrant
The State of Maryland to the Sheriff of Talbot County, Maryland:

Whereas Thomas Gummum late of Talbot County, was indicted in Talbot County Court at November Term 1850 of the crime of murder and the said Court sentenced him to be hung by the neck until he be dead.

And therefore these are to will and require as also to charge and command you that at or before the hour of one o'clock P. M. on Friday the twenty eighth day of February next you take the said Thomas Gummum from your Prison and him safely convey to the Gallows in the County aforesaid the place of the execution of Malefactors and there the said Thomas Gummum hang by the neck until he be dead: For all which this shall be your sufficient power and authority.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland this seventeenth day of December in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and fifty and of the Independence of the United States the Seventy fifth.
