

for Washington County, vice George Rizer declined serving; John Chamber vice Nathaniel Crisp, deceased; Henry Foreman, vice J. Edwin Roberts removed from the County; William H. Foreman, vice Samuel Kirby, deceased, Justice of the Peace for Queen Anne's County, and Patrick O'Neill, Justice of the Peace for Frederick County vice Thomas H. O'Neal resigned.

January 18th 1851

The Governor this day reappointed William T. Maddox, and issued a Commission for him him, as Clerk of Saint Mary's County Court, vice former Commission expired.

January 20th 1851

The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of a very large number of respectable Citizens of the City of Baltimore, pardoned Richard J. Turner, convicted at the May, April term, 1848, of the Anne Arundel County Court, for conspiring to cheat and defraud the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, and sentenced to be confined in the Public Jail for the term of seven years and to pay a fine of five hundred dollars. The Governor also remitted the fine.

January 22nd 1851

This day the Governor appointed and Commissioned Thomas G. Harris, Colonel of 1st Regiment, 1st Regimental Cavalry District M. M., vice, John McPherson, whose Commission became vacated he having failed to report as required by Resolution 7^o 84 of December Session 1847 of the General Assembly of Maryland; also appointed and Commissioned Edward Schley, Lt. Colonel 1st Regiment, Cavalry District M. M., vice, Richard Johnson, deceased, and George Cost Bizer, Major 1st Regiment, 1st Regimental Cavalry District M. M., vice, Thomas G. Harris promoted.

The Governor, upon the recommendation of Walter P. Snow and John Dale, Esquims, appointed and Commissioned Peter S. Cottingham a Justice of the District Court of the Second election District of Worcester County, vice, Samuel Johnson declined.

January 23rd 1851

The Governor this day appointed and Commissioned W. H. Stram 1st Lieutenant of the Eagle Artillery Company, 2nd Regiment of Artillery, 1st Brigade, 3rd Division M. M. vice Farlow promoted.

January 24th 1851

This day the Governor reappointed and Commissioned James Wason as Register of Wills for Washington County, vice, former Commission expired this date.

January 27th 1851

The Governor received from the Clerks of Montgomery and Queen Anne's County Courts lists of the Justices of the Peace who qualified in the said Counties for 1850.
