

March 24th 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William H. A. Turner and William M. Starr, Director of the Maryland Penitentiary, vice Wm. A. Boyd and Lemuel W. Goddell whose term expired.

March 25th 1851

The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of a number of respectable citizens of Prince Georges County, remitted a fine of ten dollars imposed on Joseph B. Harris by the Magistrate Court of the 3^d Election District of said County, held the 5th day of February 1851, for Assault and Battery on the body of A. Rhoder.

March 26th 1851

This day the Governor appointed and commissioned E. Hall Richardson Associate Justice of the Third Election District Court of Harford County, vice Wm. H. Dallam resigned.

The Governor this day received the Official Bond of William H. Dorsey, as Notary Public at Ellicotts Mills Howard District, vice Wm. Baker resigned.

The Governor remitted the recognizance which was entered into by Daniel Reittle and Henry Poffenberger, of Washington County, in the sum of eight hundred dollars, jointly and severally, for the appearance of a certain Peter H. McLaughlin before the Washington County Court, at the November Term, 1850, and which was afterwards forfeited.

March 27th 1851

The Governor this day refused to pardon Thomas Graves, of Baltimore City, charged under indictment of the Baltimore City Court, January term, 1851, of Murder, and found guilty of Murder in the Second degree.

The Governor remitted a fine of twenty dollars, (upon the recommendation of a number respectable citizens of Queen Anns County) imposed, under indictment of the Court of Queen Anns County, at the November Term, 1850, upon a certain John M. Davis, for selling intoxicating drinks on the Sabbath.

The Governor commissioned William H. Dorsey, Notary Public to reside at Ellicotts Mills, Howard District, vice Wm. Baker Dorsey resigned.

March 28th 1851

This day the Governor appointed and commissioned William M. Holiday of Allegany County, Aid-de-Camp to his Excellency with the rank of Colonel.

April 2^d 1851

This day the Governor appointed and commissioned John M. Farland Jr. of Talbot County, Justice of the Peace, vice Thomas Casson deceased; also was received and approved the Official Bond of Wm. J. Maddox Clerk of Saint Mary's County Court.
