The Governor this day received from the Convention, now sitting to alter and amend the Constitution of the State, the following order to wit:

By the Convention April 2^d 1851

Ordered that the Governor be requested, (if in his opinion it be compatible with the public interest) to cause to be transmitted to this Convention, copies of all papers and documents in relation to the case of the requisition of James S. Mitchell by the Governor of Pennsylvania.

The Governor this day issued the following death Warrant, directed to the Sheriff of Howard District:

The State of Maryland, To the Sheriff of Howard District, Greeting:

Whereas, Amos Green (negro man) late of Howard District, was convicted in Howard District Court at March Term 1851 of committing a Rape on the person of one Josephine Peep, a white woman, and the said Court sentenced him, to be hung by the neck until he be dead.

Now, therefore, these are to will and require, as also charge and command you, that at or before the hour of one o'clock, P.M., on Friday the 13th day of June next, you take the said Amos Green from your prison, and him safely convey to the gallows in the district aforesaid, the place of execution of malefactors, and there the said Amos Green hang by the neck until he be dead: For all of which this shall be your authority.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, this 4th day of April in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty one and of the Independence of the United States, the seventy fifth.
