

April 5<sup>th</sup> 1851

This day the Governor received the report of George H. Sutton, Sailed Fish Inspector, for the quarter ending 31<sup>st</sup> of March 1851.

The Governor, upon the recommendation of Thomas F. Bowie, Esq., late Deputy Attorney General, and many other respectable citizens of Prince Georges County, remitted a fine of thirty dollars and costs imposed on a certain Armand Smith by the Court of Prince Georges County, for Assault and Battery on John Mitchell.

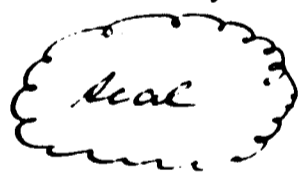
The Governor this day issued the following requisition on the Governor of Pennsylvania, for the apprehension and delivery of a certain John Neill.

State of Maryland to wit: Emock Louis Lowe Governor of the State of Maryland,  
To his Excellency, the Governor of Pennsylvania.

It appears by the annexed paper, duly authenticated according to the laws of this state, that a certain John Neill stands charged by indictment in the County Court of Washington County, in this state of having on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of March 1851 with force & arms at the County aforesaid, one horse, of the value of fifty dollars, of the goods and chattels of one Thomas Finneyan then and there being found, feloniously did steal, take and carry away, contrary to the form of the act of Assembly in such case made and provided, and against the peace, government and dignity of the state, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the jurisdiction of this state, and has taken refuge within the state of Pennsylvania and has been arrested and confined in the jail of Chambersburg.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said John Neill be apprehended and delivered to Edward M. Wise, a citizen of the State of Maryland, who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name, and the great seal of the State, this fifth day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one.

April 7<sup>th</sup> 1851

This day the Governor refused and dismissed the application of Thomas Henderson, Collector of State tax in Harford County, for a remission of interest for 1850.

April 9<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of a number of respectable citizens of Calvert County, remitted a fine of twenty dollars, imposed, at the May term 1850 of Calvert County Court, on a certain John A. Cox, indicted for an assault & battery on the person of a certain Orange.

April 7<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Walter Jarvis, Surveyor of Harford County, vice John B. Henderson resigned; also appointed and commissioned Peter Hawer, Associate Justice of District Court No 10 of Frederick County vice John C. Harbaugh refused to serve and removed from the district.
