

April 18th 1851

The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of Mr. Dudley White & Samuel H. Jagert, Esqrs., the Attorney General and a large number of respectable Citizens of Baltimore City, pardoned John Warner, Thomas Fields and William Saylor, convicted in Baltimore City Court at the April term 1851 of assaulting and beating John B. Henry, and sentenced to be imprisoned one month and each to pay a fine of ten dollars and costs; also at the same time, recommended by the same parties, pardoned William Ring, convicted at the said term of Baltimore City Court, of interfering in the rescue of a prisoner, with John B. Henry, and sentenced to be imprisoned one month and to pay a fine of ten dollars & costs.

This day was received the semiannual report of Thomas G. Howard, Liquor Gauger, up to the 1st of April 1851.

April 22nd 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John W. M. Miller Associate Justice of District Court No. 1, of Carroll County, Vice Joseph Gernand resigned.

April 23rd 1851

This day was received the Semi-Annual Return of Foreign and Domestic Spirits, Oils, Wine and Malasses gauged and inspected in the City of Baltimore from the 21st of September 1850 to the 21st of March 1851 inclusive, by Bennett Bracco, Gauger & Inspector.

April 28th 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Washington Price Inspector of Lumber at Port Deposit Cecil County, Vice Samuel C. Gale, resigned.

The Governor this day issued the following requisition on the Governor of the State of Delaware:

State of Maryland to wit: Enoch Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,
To his Excellency, the Governor of Delaware

It appears by the annexed paper, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain Abraham Taylor is suspected of having been concerned in the Murder of the Cosden Family, recently committed in Kent County in this State, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the jurisdiction of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Delaware.

Now, Therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Abraham Taylor, who has been arrested, as is represented, and is now confined in New Castle jail in New Castle County in the State of Delaware, be delivered to William Parker, Esq. a Citizen of Maryland, who is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, thence to be dealt with according to law.
