May 6<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day refused to pardon, upon the petition of Charles Coll Culloton, Larne, convicted, sometime since, in the Allegany County Court, upon a charge of shooting at a certain Henry Walter with intent to kill, and now confined in the Penitentiary,

May 8<sup>th</sup> 1851

This day the Governor refused to remit a fine of twenty dollars & costs imposed some time since, by Baltimore County Court upon Robert M. Cllland, of said County, for keeping a disorderly house; also this day was received and filed a copy of the bond of David M. Prime Register of Mills for Baltimore County.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Thomas E. Lloyd, Justice of the Peace for Talbot County, vice E. F. Ruth removed out of the County; also was received & filed a copy of the bond of Joseph Sheaffer, Collector of taxes for Carroll County.

May 12<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day refused the remission of a recognizance forfeited by Jonathan Hazel of Kent County, charged with selling an indented negro as a slave for life.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William E. Murphy, Justice of the Peace for Montgomery County, vice Reuben M. Mosley resigned.

✓ The Governor this day released from imprisonment William Edens, alias Mr. Edensborough alias Mr. Edenbro, from confinement in the jail of Montgomery County, also from the payment of five hundred dollars, imposed upon him, by Montgomery County Court at the November term 1849, for conspiring to entice certain slaves to runaway

May 13<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day released the fine of twenty five dollars, imposed upon Joseph Floyd by Saint Mary's County Court, at the March term 1851, for an assault and battery on a stranger, on or about the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February 1848.

May 17<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day issued the following requisition on the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania:

State of Maryland to wit:

Enoch Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,  
To his Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania.

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain Samuel Gowin & Margaret Gowin, did on or about the 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1851, in Cecil County, in said State of Maryland, feloniously steal and carry away, one sett Blue Stone Ware, half doz; five White Plates, one large and two small meat dishes, together with divers other goods, wares & merchandises, the property of one Manassah Blackburn; and it has been represented to me that they
