Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States, in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Samuel Gowin and Margaret Gowin, be apprehended and delivered to Edward M. Wise, who is hereby authorized to receive and convey them to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.

✓ The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Charles Lee Armon, Basil Norris, M. Baltzell, John T. Schley, Green H. Duke and one hundred and thirty five other respectable citizens of Frederick County, pardoned Robert Cipe convicted of larceny, at the November term 1850 of Frederick County Court and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary of Maryland for the term of eighteen months from the 14th day of November 1850.

May 23rd 1851

✓ The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Robert C. Brent, Mr. M. Addison, Henry May, Mr. H. Hope, James Jones and other respectable citizens of this state, pardoned Abraham Progan, convicted in Anne Arundel County Court, April term 1849, of enticing to run away, negro Cinderella, slave of Geo. F. Washington, and sentenced to serve in the Penitentiary for the space of four years.

May 26th 1851

This day was received and filed the copy Bond of Victor Clunk, as Clerk of the Maryland Penitentiary.

May 29th 1851

The Governor having this day received a requisition from the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension of a certain John Ingram, charged with the crime of "Passing Counterfeit Money," committed in the County of Chester of that state, issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Cecil County, or to the Sheriff of any other County in the State of Maryland in whose bailiwick he may be found, directing him to arrest and deliver the said John Ingram to Winton Darlington, the Agent appointed by the Governor of Pennsylvania to receive and convey him to that state.

The Governor this day remitted, upon the recommendation of many respectable citizens of Anne Arundel County, a fine of ten dollars & costs imposed, by the Court of Anne Arundel County, at the April term 1851, upon Thelie Parker (a negro woman), for an Assault & Battery on Lewis Parker.
