

June 3<sup>d</sup> 1851

The Governor this day released the interest due from Henry F. Kalkman, Collector of State tax in the 1<sup>st</sup> Collection District of Baltimore County, for the year 1846 upon the condition that the said Collector discharge the whole principal due upon said account and all costs resulting from suits &c.

June 6<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Edward G. Starr Justice of the peace for the 3<sup>d</sup> District, composed of the 9<sup>th</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> Wards, of the City of Baltimore, vice William B. Nelson removed.

This day the Governor received and accepted the resignation of William M. Starr and William H. A. Turner as Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary.

June 7<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned P. A. Vickers and William Barnes Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary, vice Starr & Turner resigned.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Washington A. Danstin, Aid-de-Camp to his Excellency with the rank of Colonel.

June 9<sup>th</sup> 1851

This day the Governor received a requisition from the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension of a certain Ephraim Garber charged, upon the oath of Elizabeth J. Goders, duly made before Samuel L. Hughes a Justice of the peace in and for the County of Washington, in the State of Pennsylvania, with the crime of "Fornication & Bastardy, and Seduction" committed in the said County of Washington, issued his warrant to the Sheriff of Frederick County, or of any other County in the State of Maryland in whose bailiwick he may be found, directing him to arrest and deliver the said Ephraim Garber to George J. Hammond, the agent appointed by the Governor of Pennsylvania to receive and convey him to that State.

June 10<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John W. Williams Inspector of Lumber in Baltimore, City vice John Joseph Latty removed, and also appointed and commissioned Cornelius Shaver, of Frederick County, Weigh Master of Live Stock in the City of Baltimore, vice Jacob Ponder removed.

June 11<sup>th</sup> 1851

This day the Governor appointed and commissioned Jonathan S. Willis, Justice of the peace for Talbot County, vice John F. Chaplain resigned.

The Governor also appointed and commissioned the following Military Officers viz: John H. J. Magouder, Colonel; George W. Wilson Lt. Colonel and Capt. John H. Boyle, Surgeon of the 17<sup>th</sup> Regiment M. M., vice Bowie & Magouder promoted and Henry Brooke deceased; William D. Bowie Aid-de-Camp to Thomas F. Bowie Brigadier General 4<sup>th</sup> Brigade 1<sup>st</sup> Division M. M.
