

August next, you take the said William Shelton from your Prison, and him safely convey to the Gallows in the County aforesaid, the place of the execution of ill-fate, and there the said William Shelton hang by the neck until he be dead: For all of which this shall be your sufficient power and Authority.

July 7th 1851

The Governor this day issued a Warrant, under a requisition of the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension of James A Jones, charged on indictment in the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Quarter Sessions of Philadelphia City and County, and for his delivery to Thomas R Scott, agent appointed by the Governor of Pennsylvania.

July 11th 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Owen S Downey Inspector of Lumber in Baltimore City vice Timothy J Faherty declined.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Daniel Haller Notary Public to reside in Frederick City, Frederick County vice Lewis Myers resigned.

July 12th 1851

The Governor this day approved and filed the Bond of Charles R Water, Inspector of Tobacco for Warehouse N^o 5, Baltimore City; also issued notices on the applications for the pardon, severally, of Jesse E. S. Quantill, James E. Wall and Thomas Miller.

July 15th 1851

This day the Governor received and approved the Official Bond of Joseph Elliott, Inspector of Flour for the City of Baltimore.

The Governor this day also received and approved the Official Bond of Alexander Cummings, Inspector of Foreign and Domestic Signors; also this day a salute was ordered to be fired in honor of the arrival of the President of the United States at the Capital of Maryland.

July 16th 1851

This day the Governor received from the Commissioners of tax for Carroll County the following communication:

Westminster Carroll County July 14th 1851

His Excellency E. Louis Lowe

Governor of Maryland,

Sir:

In obedience to the laws of this State, I hereby inform you, that the Commissioners of the Tax for Carroll County, at their meeting, on the 7th of July 1851 imposed upon the assessable property of Carroll County a tax of twenty five cents per hundred dollars for the use of the State for the year 1851.
