

August 12th 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William Fisher, Justice of the peace for Carroll County, vice John M Jones who declined qualifying.

August 16th 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William A. Disney, Justice of the peace for the 4th District in Baltimore City vice Benjamin F. Yoe, resigned; also appointed and commissioned Benjamin F. Yoe, Justice of the peace for the 5th District in Baltimore City vice William A. Disney resigned.

August 18th 1851

The Governor this day received and filed a report from the Clerk of the board of Commissioners for Worcester County that a levy for the direct tax, for the use of the State for the year 1851, had been made; and that a collector has been appointed, and bonded.

The Governor received and filed a report, from the Clerk of the board of Commissioners for Allegany County, of the Annual levy of State direct tax for said County and of the appointment and qualification of a collector.

"
The Governor remitted the interest due on the State taxes charged to Renolds M Dorsey, Collector of State taxes for the 1st Collector District of Howard District, from the 1st of January 1850 upon condition that the principal in arrear be first fully paid and satisfied, and upon the payment of all costs and commissions, if any have accrued or may accrue before final settlement. The remission as above is to date from the 16th day of June 1851.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Comegys Casden, Captain 33rd Regt. M. M. vice J. Comegys promoted, J. B. Parks 1st Lt. and Thomas Slaughter 2nd Lt. 33rd Regt. M. M. Captain Casden's Company; also George Gale, Captain of the Washington Republican Blues attached to 33rd Regt. M. M.; also Henry Bingle 1st Lt., Melcher Froelipp 2nd Lt., Henry Holdfer 3rd Lt. and John Schnellbach, Ensign of the "Washington Guards" attached to 53rd Regt.

August 19th 1851

This day the Governor appointed and commissioned William Costen Justice of the peace for Somerset County vice Henry Maddox deceased; also appointed and commissioned Robert White, Commissioner to take acknowledgment of deeds &c. to reside in Georgetown, District of Columbia; likewise appointed and commissioned George W. Kildow, of Allegany County, Inspector of Lumber in Baltimore, vice Owen S. Downey declined.

August 23rd 1851

The Governor this day received and filed a copy of the Official Bond of Thomas Hughey, as Register of Mills for Luzerne Ames County
