

August 26th 1851

The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of the Hon. Judge Nisbet, Messrs Charles F. Mayer, Christian Keener and others, pardoned Thomas Simpson alias, Miller, a convict in the Maryland Penitentiary.

August 27th 1851

The Governor this day approved the official bonds of Mr H. Frazer, Police Officer and Mr H. Flemming, Wall Guard, of the Maryland Penitentiary

August 29th 1851

The Governor this day received and filed a report, from the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners for Talbot County, that the direct tax for the use of the State has been levied for the present year, and that John S. Nabb has been appointed Collector.

August 30th 1851

The Governor this day made the following Military appointments viz: Sewellan F. Barry, Captain, Charles McDonald 1st Lt. and John & Johannes 2nd Lt. of the "Baltimore City Guards" attached to 53rd Regt. M. V. I

September 1st 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Alfred Stincham Justice of the peace for Anne Arundel County, vice Samuel Day resigned.

The Governor also made the following Military appointment, C. Gerhardt 2nd Lt. "German Yeager" attached to 53rd Regt. M. V. I.

September 3rd 1851

This day the Governor ordered notice to be given in the "Gazette" and "Star" of Easton, Talbot County, of the application of Theodore R. Lockerman, Esq. of said County, for a Nolle Prosequi in his behalf, under an indictment found against him at the May term, of Talbot County Court, 1851; and directed notice to continue until the 20th instant.

September 6th 1851

The Governor this day ordered a notice to be given in the Easton "Star," Talbot County, that application has been made to him for three several Nolle Prosequis to release Jacob Stevens, a slave for life, the property of W. Battle, Esq.; Isaac Stevens, a slave for life, the property of Spedden Orem, Esq.; and Amaal Branning, a slave for life the property of John Harris, Esq.; who are now confined in the Jail of Talbot County in this State under the charge of running away from the service of their said owners without their consent; which is a felony under an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed December session 1847 Chap. 309. Notice was accordingly given that the cases would be taken up for final decision on or after Monday the 22nd instant.
