

September 15<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day received and filed the Semi-Annual Report of Edward Cooley, Inspector of Foreign and Domestic Liquors in the City of Baltimore.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Jafe Manning, Justice of the Peace for Carroll County, vice Sabey, gone deceased.

September 19<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day ordered notice to be given that application has been made for a Habeas Corpus in behalf of Samuel Fardoe of Calvert County, who is now under bail for his appearance at the October term, 1851, of the Calvert County Court, for killing a certain free Negro man named Abraham Bannister. Notice was accordingly given that the case would be taken up for final decision on or after Thursday, the 9<sup>th</sup> day of October 1851.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Lucius Pittkin Commissioner to take acknowledgment of deeds &c. to reside in the City of New York.

The Governor this day issued the following requisition.

State of Maryland. To wit:-

E. Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,

To the Excellency the Governor of Ohio:

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain William Childs, a citizen of the State of Ohio, stands charged upon the oath of William B. Townsend, a member of the firm of Loney, Townsend and Loney, of the City of Baltimore, with having represented himself as a member of the firm of J. Childs & Norris, of Cincinnati, Ohio, and in said capacity obtained goods under false pretenses of the said firm of Loney, Townsend and Loney, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Ohio.

Now therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said William Childs be apprehended and delivered to Edward M. Wise and John Bell who are hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to Law.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name, and the Great Seal of the State, this twentieth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one
