

November 24<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day received and filed the Copy Bond of George Hoskins, as Register of Wills for Frederick County, to the State of Maryland.

November 25<sup>th</sup> 1851

✓ The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of Judge Strick, Wm M. Addison, Esq, Otho W Eichelberger, William O. Welsh, William Bartlett and Wm J. Downing, Esqs. Jurors at the trial, Joseph E. Wilson, Andrew Reese, Talbot Gosnell, Basil Root, Isaac M. Benson Esqs., and many other highly respectable citizens of Baltimore City, granted a pardon to John Henry Wreke, negro, convicted, at the February term, 1842, of Baltimore City Court, of the crime of arson and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the term of fourteen years.

The Governor received and filed a Copy of the Bond given to the State of Maryland by Nathaniel Hickman, Register of Wills for Baltimore City; also received and filed two Copy bonds given to the State of Maryland by James Parratt, Clerk of the Circuit Court for Talbot County.

November 26<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor received and filed two Copy Bonds given to the State of Maryland by Horace Resley, Clerk of the Circuit Court for Allegany County.

November 29<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day received and filed a Copy Bond to the State of Maryland given by William R. McCulley, Register of Wills for Allegany County.

The Governor Commissioned, from the fourteenth to the twenty ninth day of November 1851 inclusive, two hundred and fifty seven of the Elective Officers for the several Counties, Districts, State at large and Baltimore City, as shown by the Record Book, designated "Record of Elective Officers Commissioned" reference being had thereto, from folio N<sup>o</sup> 2 to folio N<sup>o</sup> 28 will more fully show.

December 1<sup>st</sup> 1851

The Governor this day appointed and Commissioned Rufus King Hartley Commissioner to take acknowledgement of deeds &c to reside at Galveston, Texas.

The Governor this day Commissioned the following Elective Officers for Worcester County viz: James Higgins, James Hamnerley, James Cooper, William K. Evans, Fielder G. Jones, John S. Willis and John Muir, elected November 5<sup>th</sup> 1851 as County Commissioners.

December 3<sup>d</sup> 1851

The Governor received a requisition from the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension and delivery of a certain Isaac Shafer who is charged with the crime of forgery &c and is a fugitive from justice; Whereupon the Governor issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Baltimore City or County or to the Sheriff in any other part in the State of Maryland for his arrest and surrender to the agent of Pennsylvania.
