

February 7th 1852.

The Governor this day nominated to the Senate John C. Calhoun as Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals; also the several Chief Judges of the Orphan's Courts of the several Counties and Baltimore City; likewise Stephen Beard, as Judge of the Orphan's Court for Anne Arundel County, vice Stephens Gambrell, deceased.

February 9th 1852

This day the Governor commissioned Price John Goldsborough as States Attorney for Dorchester County;

February 10th 1852

The Governor this day laid before the Legislature a preamble and resolutions passed by the select and common Councils of the City of Philadelphia.

Also transmitted to the Senate, the returns of the Judges of Election, and the Certificate of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Washington County, attesting the election of George French Esq. as Senator for said County;

Also transmitted to the House of Delegates the returns of the Judges of Election, and the certificate of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Frederick County attesting the election Henry McElfresh, Esq. as a Delegate for said County.

February 13th 1852

The Governor this day received the following order from the House of Delegates:

By the House of Delegates February 13th 1852.

Ordered that the Governor be requested to inform this house what action has been taken by him in relation to the contested Commissioners election in Somerset, and in relation to a commission heretofore issued by him to John M. Carraw as Commissioner of said County.

February 14th 1852
